## **Early Spring Plant Care**

Tips for caring for your plants (newly planted or not-yet-planted) in the early spring when temps can still be chilly:



Cover your plants (with a blanket - not plastic) or bring them inside at night with any temperature predicted at 38°F or colder



Plants should be outside during the day when temps are above 45°F so they get enough light (indoor lighting - even a bright window - is far from sufficient)



## Water with care!

- Plants do not need much water in cool spring temps
- Plants should dry out before watering (stick your finger in the soil to test dryness)
- The smaller the pot, the more frequently it will dry out and need watered
- Remember to fertilize when watering

Can withstand cool weather and even a light frost (though they won't look their best if temperatures dip below 34°F)
